Phonics Treasure Hunt

Write the clues on bits of paper and hide around the house (and the garden if you can).

Give your child the first clue, they then have to spot and underline the diagraphs. They can then sound out the words to read the clue and then they can find the next one.

An example of a diagraph could be: oi, oo, er, oe etc.

Clues

- 1. On the toilet seat.
- 2. On top of the toaster.
- 3. In (name)'s shoes.
- 4. On your bed, under your pillow.
- 5. In the bath.
- 6. On (name)'s hair brush.
- 7. On your toothbrush.
- 8. In the drawer with the: (spoons/forks/plates).

This is where you would put the prize: if it is something edible you could right 'eat the treat'

You can then get your child to write their own clues for you to do a treasure hunt.
