In our assembly this week we looked at the significance of the Lunar New Year, a festival celebrated by millions around the world, marking the beginning of the new lunar calendar.

We discussed the origins of the Lunar New Year, highlighting its roots in ancient Chinese history and how it is celebrated across various Asian cultures. We spoke about the key traditions such as cleaning the house to sweep away bad luck, family reunions and special meals. We also explained the symbolism of the Chinese zodiac, focusing on the animal representing the current year. We highlighted traditional activities such as dragon dances and the significance of red envelopes. In 2025, the festivities began on January 29th and continue for 15 days, ending with the Lantern Festival on February 12th

Good working Relationships

As a school we are all aware of the importance of good working relationships and all recognise the importance of these relationships to equip our children with the necessary skills for their education. For these reasons we will continue to welcome and encourage parents and carers to participate fully in the life of our school.

We are committed to resolving difficulties in a constructive manner, through an open and positive dialogue. However, we understand that everyday misunderstandings can cause frustrations and have a negative impact on our relationships. Where issues arise or misconceptions take place, please contact a member of our office team, who will be available to direct you to the right person to meet with you and go through the issue and hopefully resolve it. Where issues remain unresolved, please follow the school's complaints procedure. This is available on the school website or a copy can be requested from the school office.

I feel we need to clarify the types of behaviour that will not be tolerated and we seek parental agreement to these expectations.

Behaviour that will not be tolerated:

- Disruptive behaviour which interferes or threatens to interfere with any of the schools normal operation or activities anywhere on the school premises.
- Any inappropriate behaviour on the school premises.
- Using loud or offensive language or displaying temper.
- Threatening in any way, a member of staff, visitor, fellow parent/carer or child.
- Damaging or destroying school property.
- Sending abusive or threatening emails or text/voicemail/phone messages or other written communications (including social media) to anyone within the school community.
- Defamatory, offensive or derogatory comments regarding the school or any of the pupils/parents/staff/ governors at the school on Facebook or other sites
- The use of physical, verbal or written aggression towards another adult or child. This includes physical punishment of your own child on school premises.
- Approaching someone else's child in order to discuss or chastise them because of the actions of this
 child towards their own child. (Such an approach to a child may be seen to be an assault on that child
 and may have legal consequences).
- Smoking, vaping, taking illegal drugs or the consumption of alcohol on school premises. (Alcohol may only be consumed during authorised events).
- Dogs being brought on to the school premises. (Other than guide dogs)

Should **any** of the above occur on school premises or in connection with school the school may feel it is necessary to take action by contacting the appropriate authorities or consider banning the offending adult from entering the school premises.

It is important for parents and carers to make sure any persons collecting or dropping children are aware of these expectations

Together we create a positive and uplifting environment not only for the children but also all who work and visit our school.

Jewellery/Nail Polish

We kindly remind you of our school policy regarding nail varnish, acrylic nails, and jewellery. To maintain a safe and focused learning environment, we ask that students refrain from wearing nail varnish, acrylic nails, and jewellery, except for small stud earrings. This policy is in place to prevent distractions and ensure the safety of all pupils during school activities.
